## Prom Safety Tips

### For Prom-Parents & Planners

**1. Plan to Have a Plan:** Make sure the attendees plan their night ahead of time. "Winging it" on prom night is never a good idea. This is not just about safety, but it also makes sure that the clothes, the flowers, the meal, and the ride are all lined up for an excellent night of memories.

**2. Who is Going with Who?** Get a list of all the people that are attending with your student. Make sure they understand they need to stay with their group. There is safety in numbers. If possible, get the cell numbers of the people they are traveling with. If they know you have everyone else's numbers, they may be more likely to answer your texts. 😊

**3. Before Prom Plan for After Prom:** Something is always happening after the prom. Make sure there is a solid plan and a real destination. Sometimes parents or the school will plan an after-prom event. Make sure you know where they are going and for how long.

**4. It's OK to Call the Help Line:** Proms can be an intense experience and sometimes it can all become a little too much. Make it clear to your prom-goer that you're ready and willing to pick them up whenever and wherever they are. No questions asked. Prom nights can take some strange turns, and your student needs to know they can count on you for an easy way out.

**5. Travel Light:** Keep personal belongings and valuable items to a minimum. It is nice to show things off, but the less they bring the less there is to lose. Encourage them to bring only the essentials. This allows everyone to focus on enjoying their fun night instead of keeping track of precious items, or worse, looking for lost stuff. 😞

**6. Pre-Prom Prep with Participating Prom Parents:** Make sure you know the names and numbers of the other parents in your student's prom posse. It is best to reach out to them before the big night. There is safety in numbers with parents too. It is good to make sure all the prom-parents are on the same page and know the prom plans. Prom prep can be a little nerve racking, so it is good to talk it over with other parents.

**7. The Time is Now:** Make sure it is clear to everyone what time your teen needs to be home from prom. Make the time reasonable but also make it clear. Also be straight about what happens if they are late and don't check-in. As a prom-parent, it is usually best to stay up until your teen returns safely.

**8. Make Good Prom Choices:** Prom can sometimes present challenges and temptations to the prom attendees. It is always best to discuss these possibilities ahead of time with your student to make sure they are prepared to make good choices if these bad situations present themselves. Make sure they know that these choices have real consequences even on prom night.

**9. Cell Phone Defense:** Many bad things can happen to a teen's poor phone at prom, drowned in a punch bowl, danced on, dropped, lost, or just dead. All very sad. Make sure your prom-goer has a written list of phone numbers that they can use if their phone suffers a terrible fate. This also eliminates the excuse, "But I didn't know your number!" A charging chord is a nice thing to carry, and a backup battery is even better.

**10. Leave the Driving to the Prom Professionals:** We are kind of partial to this tip. We have been taking prom-goers to the night of their lives for more than 30 years. A chauffeur-driven ride makes a great night even better and it gives you the peace of mind to know a professionally-trained driver is taking them everywhere they need to go and nowhere they shouldn't go. Even if you don't book with Crown Limousine, we hope you will consider putting a professional in the driver's seat on Prom night.

# Prom Ride Rentals-Policies, Rules, & Restrictions

**By making this reservation for a prom vehicle and accepting this confirmation, you are confirming that you have read and will comply with all the rules and regulations spelled out in this agreement. You are responsible for this vehicle and the financial obligation of this reservation. Please call if you have any further questions, 205-758-3875.**

**All prom reservations require a minimum \$400.00 deposit to be paid at time of booking. This deposit will be applied to the balance and is non-refundable. The full balance is due at least two weeks prior to the event date. All prom rentals require a four-hour minimum. Pick up locations other than the Tuscaloosa, Alabama area will be subject to rental charges from the time the vehicle leaves our location in Tuscaloosa until it returns.** For safety and insurance purposes, some Crown vehicles are equipped with cameras that capture images of both the road and in the vehicle cabin. Passenger's images may be captured by these devices, but these images are used only for safety and insurance purposes and are never archived. **Vehicles must be reserved by a person twenty-one years of age or older. All deposits are non-refundable. A 15% gratuity for your chauffeur is included in your rate.**

**1. No alcohol in the limousine.** No alcoholic beverages of any kind are allowed in or near the limousine. If passengers appear to be intoxicated or become belligerent, the driver may choose to end the ride early. Be respectful of yourself, your passengers, and your driver. Just don't do it.

**2. Be responsible and respectful.** When you rent a limousine, you are making a promise to be responsible and respectful for the vehicle you have chosen. A limousine is an expensive piece of equipment, and it is up to you and your friends to treat it that way. Any damages done to the limousine by you or your friends will be charged to you. This includes, but is not limited to: getting sick in the vehicle (cleaning fee = \$150), torn seats, broken TVs, etc. It is up to you to make sure these extra charges do not occur. Be sure to explain this and all other rules to your friends. Choose your companions carefully. This is always good advice, but on prom night it is especially important. One obnoxious limousine companion can ruin a fantastic prom for everyone. Choose responsible and considerate people to share this special night. Remember you will be liable for all damages caused by your traveling companions. Choose wisely.

**3. No smoking or vaping in or near the limousine.** Smoking is a nasty and dangerous habit anyway, but when it is done in an enclosed car it is even worse. No one wants their limo to smell like smoke when they get in and you shouldn't either. Smoking near the vehicle with the doors open can be just as bad. As for vaping, well that just makes you look stupid and smells like burning candy. Not cool.

**4. All prom limousine reservations must be signed for by a parent, guardian, or responsible adult.** The person signing the contract must be 21 years old and should make the rules clear to the prom goers and discuss their expectations for the group's behavior. The signer of the contract will be held financially responsible for any damages that occur.

**5. Obey the capacity limitations of the vehicle you reserved.** If a vehicle is listed as "10 passengers", that's it. These limits are not just a rule, in many cases they are set by law. The driver will only allow the designated number of riders in the vehicle. Don't leave someone standing on the curb on prom night. Book the ride that fits your needs.

**6. Four-Hour minimum and a \$400.00 deposit.** All prom reservations must be for a minimum of 4 hours. Since most of our proms happen out of town, this is usually not a problem. Rental time for out-of-town proms begins when the limousine leaves Crown's garage and ends when it returns to our garage. All time over the initial 4 hours will be billed at the hourly rate for that particular vehicle in 1/2 hour increments. All prom rides require a \$400 deposit to be paid when the reservation is made. The remainder of the reservation charge must be paid in full at least two weeks prior to the event. Any cancellation will result in the forfeiture of all monies paid to date. Be very sure when you book any vehicle that you really want it.
